ENGAGE IN WONDER

How does the moon illustrate God's living story? Reflect on all
you're learned.

Here are some additional questions to ignite your curiosity and
imagination:

- Why do you think God made the moon wax and wane? In what
ways might that illustrate God's story?
- A new moon isn't visible for 3 days? Do you think God did that
on purpose?
- Why do you think God made the moon only able to reflect light
instead of having light of its own?
- What position does the moon need to be in to reflect the most
light (full moon)?
- The word "month" comes from the word "moon". Do you think
God intentionally meant for the sun and moon to provide a
calendar and clock in the sky? What does that tell us about his
story?
- In the Bible the word for "helper" or "help meet" means
"opposite him". Read 1 Cor 11:3, 7-8. How might the sun-moon
relationship shine light on the relationships between Christ &
the church?
